## MLI's Canada and the Indo-Pacific Initiative: Briefing series

In an effort to improve Canada's approach to the opportunities and challenges in the Indo-Pacific region, earlier this year, the Macdonald-Laurier Institute officially launched a dedicated "Canada and the Indo-Pacific Initiative." This important new project will look at this pivotal region which has become a centre of geoeconomic and geostrategic gravity. Indeed, the true litmus test for the rules-based order will be its ability to evolve and withstand the challenges in the Indo-Pacific in the coming years. The COVID-19 crisis has only heightened these challenges and proven the need for Canada to develop a robust, comprehensive, and multipronged approach to the region.

Up until this point, successive governments have failed to lay out a clear strategy for how Canada can develop a robust role in the Indo-Pacific. Yet the world's future will likely be shaped in this crucial region. On one hand, the Indo-Pacific contains four of the world's five largest economies and over half of global GDP. On the other hand, it also plays host to some of the most significant challenges to the rules-based international order, including managing China's rise, North Korea's nuclear weapons program, tensions between India and Pakistan, conflicts over freedom of the seas, and much

The threats and opportunities emanating from the region present Ottawa with a compelling need to engage the region more substantively. Through stronger collaboration with allies and partners, there is an opportunity to transform Canada's role from one of a fair-weather partner to that of a regional power engaged on key economic, trade, security, and defence issues.

MLI has long been the leading voice in Canada on rethinking how we engage in this region. By further expanding our work into a dedicated initiative, MLI seeks to provide even greater guidance and clarity for policy-makers in search of a coherent approach to the region. Frankly, the need for this initiative is self-evident and the future of Canada's security, prosperity, and place in the rules-based global order will be determined in the Indo-Pacific region. Canadians deserve answers as to how our government plans on proceeding, and MLI's work will provide a framework for policy-makers as they navigate these issues.

Through our Canada and the Indo-Pacific Initiative, MLI has kicked off discussion on key challenges and opportunities in this region in both security and economic terms. This includes three webinars (one forthcoming) highlighting a range of expert voices across the region to look at challenges to maritime security and the need for open and transparent trade and infrastructure. Our capstone webinar at the end of this month will weave these themes from earlier sessions to examine what this all means for Canada's engagement in the region.

One important element of our project, in addition to our webinar series, is a policy briefing series that will look at a range of challenges in this region. Specifically, in the coming weeks this series will cover three issues of concern. First, we will present a policy brief exploring the growth of strategic competition between the United States and China, and its impact on regional security and Canada. While Beijing remains an important part of the Indo-Pacific, it must abide by international laws and norms for it to shift the perception of many in the region that it is an adversary. China's increasing assertive posture in the maritime realm is of deep concern, in addition to its predatory lending practices and coercive diplomacy. As Canada looks to develop its approach to the region, managing the challenge posed by Chinese activities is a significant – but not all encompassing – consideration.

The second policy brief will look at the situation on the Korean peninsula and

in particular the sustained threat posed by North Korea's nuclear weapons program and proliferation of missiles. This paper will build on the discussion on US-China strategic competition and discuss another heated security challenge in the Indo-Pacific. While most of the international attention is zeroed in on Chinese ambitions in the region, the stability of the Korean peninsula remains crucial to a secure region and Pyongyang's growing weapons capabilities continued to threaten key partners for Canada in the region, especially Japan and South Korea.

Finally, our series will end with a policy brief that discusses how Canada should approach the Indo-Pacific. Despite a long history of engagement, the consistency of Canada's role often appears unmoored and not fully aligned with our interests and stakes in the significant geopolitical shifts taking place here. A frequent critique from stakeholders and officials in the region is that Canada must make a more consistent and comprehensive approach that demonstrates an investment of time and capital that goes beyond merely trade and investment. Specifically, there is a need and desire – at least from most states – for a strong Canadian voice on political-security developments, be it on maritime security, nuclear non-proliferation or the plethora of non-traditional security challenges facing the region. This is where the tenets, rules and values that form the basis of the emerging growth of Indo-Pacific frameworks will help Canada better serve its interests and promote its role.

Canadians want answers about how their government should respond to the geoeconomic and geostrategic developments in the Indo-Pacific – from the growing strategic competition between Beijing and Washington to the sustained threat posed by a nuclear North Korea. This series will provide nuanced analysis of these developments and a clear-eyed view of Canadian priorities, thereby helping to set a course for our country to embrace its role in the Indo-Pacific and support a more durable global order in that region.

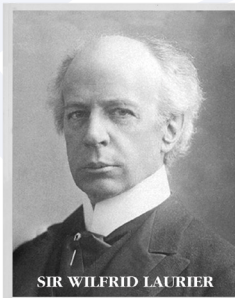
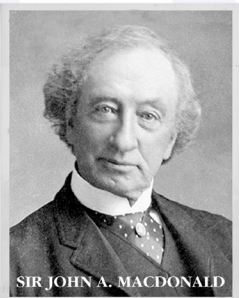
